School is out, the weather is warm, Summer is here! For many summertime means a relaxed schedule with no school, shorter workdays, and vacations. It is a joy-filled season and a time to make memories. However, it can also be a time that many will take a vacation from their spiritual life. We should not take a break from God. With more time on your hands, summer can be a wonderful time to challenge yourself and grow closer to Christ. Each week, I will offer you a challenge, a scripture verse and a prayer. 12 suggestions on how to “soak up the sun” this summer.

Challenge 9 Power Off: Take some time to power off and disconnect from all your devices and social media. If you can't go off the grid, just pick a day that you can set everything aside. When you feel tempted to check your phone or computer, say a prayer instead. Listen for God to speak when you turn out the noise of the world.

THE SOCIETY FOR THE PROPAGATION OF THE FAITH

Father Michaelsami Arockiam presently ministering St. Mary Parish, Belleville, is preaching a mission appeal in our parishes this weekend, at Holy Cross-Wendelin on July 16 and on July 17 at the 8 AM mass at St. Joseph-Olney and the 10 AM mass at Holy Cross-Wendelin. Father Michael is from the Diocese of Cuddapah, India and prior to his coming to serve our Diocese of Belleville in July 2021, he was the Director of the Benedictine Sisters of Christ the Light, his Diocesan congregation. He preaches a mission appeal on behalf of the Sisters who are running Asha Nilayam – a High School with boarding facilities for speech and hearing-impaired children in the Diocese. The institutes identifies, evaluates and provides facilities for these challenged children to grow and complete their high school education; it provides free food, clothing, boarding facilities and education inclusive of a speech therapy. At present, it is educating 32 boys and 21 girls with the help of 13 teaching and non-teaching staff members. A gift of \$200 will help the child to get a pair of hearing aids; a gift of \$300 will help a child to get a sewing machine or a computer or a carpentry kit; a gift of \$700 will provide a speech and hearing-impaired child to have one year education in this institute. Father Michael, a priest of 38 years, appeals to all of us for our contributions and thus to become part of the Universal Mission of Christ Jesus who still suffers in these challenged children and carries on His ministry of healing in and through us, His Church. May your contribution bring glory for Christ in His own Church! God bless.
