Vocation Corner: April 12, 2026

Today’s Gospel is the familiar story of Thomas’ declaration of unbelief in the Resurrection until “I put my finger in the nail marks.” These kinds of thoughts often attack the minds of those discerning a religious vocation. They are seeking that “definite” sign that the path they are pursuing is the right one. The Lord does not always afford that. Let us pray often for these discerners that they “hear the call” of the Lord and continue to respond to it.

Respect Life Corner: April 12, 2026

On the Second Sunday of Easter, the Church celebrates the Sunday of Divine Mercy. It provides an important opportunity to share Christ’s message of mercy, especially with those who suffer because of their participation in one or more abortions. By the age of 45, as many as 1 in 3 women have had an abortion, and a similar number of men and family members have been involved. Many feel that abortion is “the unforgivable sin.” They need to hear that, through the Sacrament of Reconciliation, God forgives every sin of a repentant heart, even the sin of abortion. In fact, Jesus’ message to St. Faustina is that the greater the sinner, the greater the right to His mercy.

Journey this Easter season and beyond with praying the Chaplet of Divine Mercy daily and recall the words of St. Faustina and say throughout the day: *Jesus, I trust in You- Jesus, I trust in You - Jesus, I trust in You!* Journey onward in Love and Mercy! Our Lady of Fatima, pray for us!

Have mercy on us!***

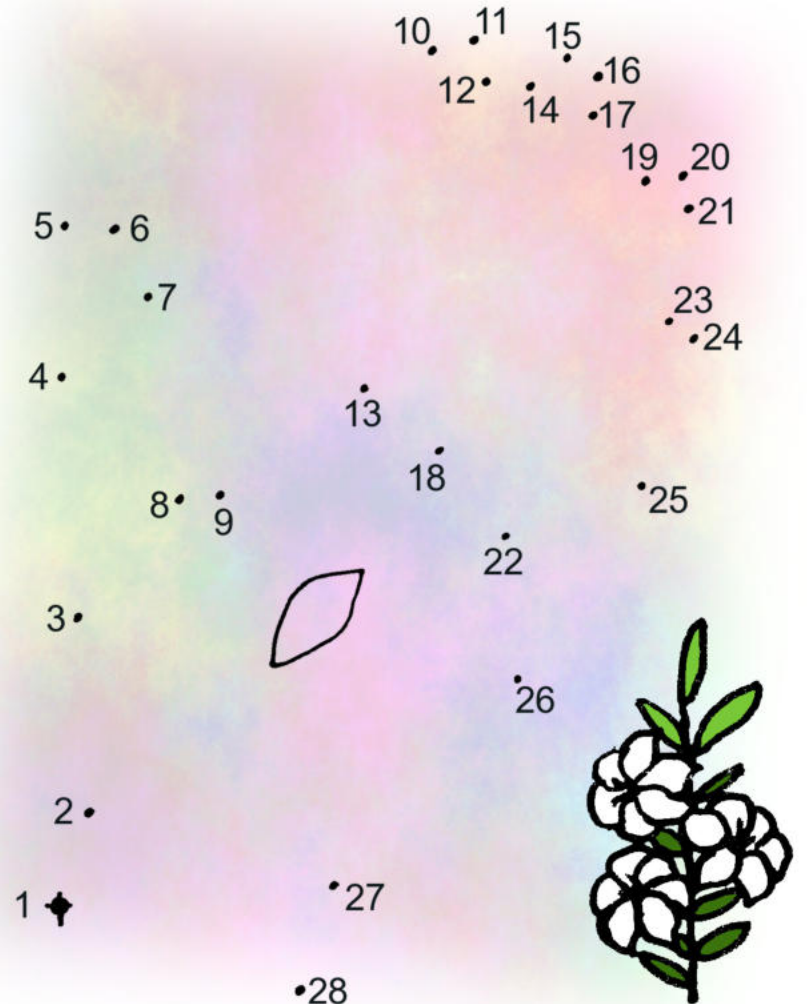
