This movie is not rated, but was created with an adult audience in mind. It may contain violence indicative of the life and times the character portrayed. Frassati was a handsome, athletic and fun-loving young man from a rich, aristocratic Italian family who

turned from a life of privilege to one devoted to working with the poor, suffering and homeless, and was a courageous witness of Christian faith and charity to many others. An avid mountain climber, Frassati exemplified a great love for life, nature and humanity. He was a leader of youth in Italy in Catholic social justice and charitable organizations and is the patron saint of World Youth Days. He died of the polio virus at the age of 24.

An avid mountain climber, Frassati exemplified a great love for life, nature and humanity. He was a leader of youth in Italy in Catholic social justice and charitable organizations and is the patron saint of World Youth Days. He died of the polio virus at the age of 24.
